School or community-based projects based in some of Britain's most deprived / high crime estates, **working intensively** with a core group of fifty 13-16 year olds identified as most at risk of offending, truancy, school or social exclusion. 15 of the YIPs managed by Crime Concern form part of the YJB's 70 strong YIP programme. Junior Youth Inclusion Projects

Junior YIPs aim to reduce social exclusion, offending and other adverse outcomes among a target group of 8-12 year olds identified as being at high risk through work in schools, in neighbourhoods and with families. Their approaches and core processes are closely modelled on YIPs.

Other

- **3D**
A successor to the West Itchen Neighbourhood Safety Project (WINS), 3D works with a range of project partners to provide exit routes from prostitution in central Southampton.
- **Cheshire Early Prevention Programme**
Programme to prevent and reduce offending amongst children and young people aged 8 to 13 in targeted areas of Cheshire through the development of projects based on the Youth Justice Board's models for Junior Youth Inclusion Programmes and Youth Inclusion Support Panels. Includes Youth Inclusion Support Panels in Crewe & Nantwich and Ellesmere Port.
- **Safer Luton Partnership**
In effect, Luton's Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership. The partnership delivers a range of services, including home security improvements, a motor project and early years prevention.
- **Safe & Sound: South Kilburn Community Safety Shop**
Broad-based neighbourhood crime reduction project with a strong emphasis on community engagement. The project includes distinct strands aimed at tackling repeat victimisation and developing anti-drugs initiatives.
- **Staffordshire Supported Lodgings Scheme**
Project providing supported lodgings to young offenders as an alternative to custody.
- **Suffolk Mediation and Reparation Service**
Mediation and reparation service delivered on behalf of the Suffolk Youth Offending Service.
- **Basic skills, London**
Accredited basic skills provision embedded into music, sports and ICT programmes across 10 London boroughs. Funded by the London Development Agency and the Learning and Skills Councils, the programme is being delivered through existing Crime Concern projects and with a number of external delivery partners.
