The Youth Detached Team is part of the Luton Youth Inclusion Programme. We aim to get the Young people diverted into different activities such as music, sports and arts.

One of the areas we work is Lewsey Farm, in Dominic Square we have a café called the Ballistic Zone. In there, there is a pool table and computers as well as tables and chairs and hot food and drinks until 6pm.

It is open for underprivileged young people (13—16) every evening from 3:30 till 6pm and Wednesdays and Friday evening to the older youths from 6—9pm.

We also do some work in High town where we have a portable youth club facility called the POD.

In there you can find a pool table and chairs as well music equipment and outside there is a Basketball Hoop. It is open on Tuesdays from 6—9pm.

The C.A.T.S scheme or Community Auto Training Scheme is run in partnership between Barnfield Technology College and the Luton Youth Inclusion Programme.

It is situated at the back of Luton Youth House and runs 2 courses simultaneously for a period of 15 weeks.

Each course holds on average 10 pupils, during these weeks the pupils are required to turn up twice a week and will be taught the Foundation Level II City and Guilds course.

This course will then give them an understanding of basic car maintenance.

The young people are referred to the course through the Luton Youth Offending Team, Luton Youth Inclusion Programme and also Schools.

The Luton Youth Inclusion Programme is one of many YIP's nationwide set up by the Youth Justice Board. We cover the Bury Park neighbourhood.

We receive referrals from various agencies that work in that area that feel a young person deemed at risk of or have offended, or due to educational issues and anti social behaviour would benefit from interventions from us.

From all the referrals that we receive we then break it down into the Top 50 most at risk young people. These get reviewed every 6 months. The Youth Justice Board set us targets as follows,

- Reduce crime amongst the Top 50 by 70%.
- Engage 38 of the Top 50 every month
- To provide, on average a total of 5 hours intervention per person per month.

Some of the different types of interventions we provide are, Educational Support, Evening drop-ins, Workshops, Residentials and some sporting activities.

The Safer Luton Partnership
